ANNEXURE-II
ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK OF CURRICULUM BY THE STUDENTS (2013-2014)

Introduction :

A curriculum is a planned programme of activities to achieve the objective of education. According to the secondary education commission, curriculum does not mean only the academic subject traditionally taught in schools and colleges but it includes the totality of all experiences that students should know through the manifold activities that go on in the college, class room, library, laboratory, workshop, and playground and in the numerous informal activities and contact between teachers and students. In this sense, the whole life of the college becomes the curriculum, which can touch the life of the students at all points and helps in attaining a balanced personality, However, study of any subject and achievement of educational objectives depend upon the type of curriculum that is framed and prescribed according to the requirements of standards or classes and as well as the way in which it is taught and implemented.

The curriculum of the faculties of Arts, Commerce and Science is designed by the Board of Studies of different subjects in the university and is implemented by all the affiliated colleges. Feedback is the best tool to evaluate and improve the quality of curricula according to the needs of society and region. The feedback of curricula by students for Arts, Commerce and Science faculties in the college has been taken.

Objectives :

The objectives of feedback of curricula by students are as follows:

1. To provide better mechanism for feedback of curricula.
2. To review and evaluate the present status of curricula.
3. To estimate and absorb the potential needs of students and society.
4. To give suggestion for improvement in the curricula as per the demand of students and society.

Methodology :

A questionnaire, comprising 7 questions, was provided to students to take feedback on all aspects of the college. B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. third year students were selected randomly to collect the required information. The collected data was classified according to faculty. The percentage tool was used to analyze the data.

Results :

The following are the important results of the feedback :

- Out of the 30 students selected randomly from the B.A., B.Com. & B.SC. third year classes, majority of the students have selected their optional subjects according to their interest and liking for the subjects.
- Majority of students opt subject in science, commerce, P.A., History & Economics as they think there is opportunity in employment and useful in competitive examinations.
- There were some students who opted some subject just because 'they believed, the subjects' provide practical knowledge useful in regular (daily) life.
- Some of the subjects opted by students are useful in day to day life.

- Effective teaching is also pointed out as one of the reason for selecting the subjects
- Many of students were satisfactory about the curriculum as well as its usefulness.
- Some students from commerce wing suggested to prepare curriculum as per the need of the industry and business.
- While addressing the question whether the curriculum is useful in solving the problems in your practical life, 88% students were of the opinion that 'Yes' this curricula helps them to solve the problems of the practical life. It is interesting to note that the students were highly appreciative of Commerce, Computer, Sociology and Marathi, However, 12.00% students maintained that the curriculum provides a booking knowledge and fail to solve practical problems.
- While noting their suggestion cum ideas to improve the existing curricula, majority of the students expressed their satisfaction as well as their expectation. Most of the students urged that curricula needs to be practical, accessible, future shaping industry based, and providing solution to the real life problems.
- A number of students were critical regarding the periods and syllabus of Zoology and Computer and expressed their dissatisfaction about the syllabus and conduction of classes of Computer Science. Some suggested that computer should have practical based curriculum and there should be introduction of English method and computer in commerce.
- Answering to the question 'can you suggest any new courses?', most of the students suggested that subjects like psychology, Geography, Home Science, and new employment oriented courses like MBA, and foundational COC course on computer should be launched. Most of the students were of the opinion that there should be updating of course, introduction of new concepts, and practical syllabus. Students also suggested that starting Post-graduation in some subject. They were appreciative of some COC courses already available in the college and introduction of MPSC / UPSC useful syllabus.
- There was a mix response for the question that whether students are ready to complete non granted course by paying the due fees. Majority of the students were of the opinion that due to their poor economic background and costly nature of non-grant courses they cannot go for it.

ANNEXURE-III
ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK OF COLLEGE BY PARENTS (2013-2014)

Introduction :

A college provides educational services to the students. The satisfaction of stakeholders i.e. students and parents is necessary therefore it is necessary to take feedback of the college from the parents of students. It will be helpful for further improvement of the college.

Objectives :

To verify the overall performance of the college campus, staff drinking water facility and transportation, etc.

To evaluate the present status of college campus.

Methodology :

A questionnaire, comprising 11 questions, was provided to parents to take feedback on all aspects of the college. Some parent were selected randomly to collect the required information. The collected data was classified and analyzed. The percentage tools was used to analyze the data.

Results :

- Almost 55.50% parents appreciated their response as excellent about college campus.
- 64.44% parents evaluated college timings as average.
- 38.88% parents registered their dissatisfaction on the facility of drinking water.
- 37.77% parents evaluated canteen facility as good and the same was the response about toilet facility with their 27.77% response.
- 47.77% parents answered their response as below average regarding parking and transport facility.
- 71.11%parents were high and appreciative about their response on teaching staff.
- Almost 58.88% parents maintained that the discipline on the campus was excellent.
- 52.22% parents believed that administrative staff was very good and satisfactory.
- 49.39% parents registered their response as good on overall impression about the college.
- It is necessary to create additional toilet facility, classroom clearing, transport facility pure and drinking water availability etc. in the college campus. Most of the parents appreciates are our teaching staff.

ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK OF OFFICE BY THE STUDENTS (2013-2014)

Introduction :

The college office is the most important part of the college administration as it provides services to students, parents, and teachers. To improve the quality of office work the process of feedback can be used. The feedback of college has been taken from students.

Objectives :

- 1) To evaluate the present status of office of the college.
- 2) To seek the stakeholder's opinion about college administration.

Methodology :

A questionnaire, comprising 12 questions, was provided to students to take feedback on all aspects of the office. The B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. third year students were selected randomly to collect the required information. The collected data was classified and analyzed. The percentage tool was used to analyze the data.

Results :

- 72.00% percent students registered their feedback on working hours as good.
- Near about 60.66% percent students expressed their satisfaction with the easiness in admission process. Nearly 72.00% students answered that the availability of various forms and prospects were excellent.
- 76.66% students also rated timely display of notices as excellent.
- Almost 86.66% students registered their response as excellent regarding the display of time tables (Regular & examinations).
- 60.66% students mentioned their response as good in terms of timely distribution of mark sheets.
- 58.66% students mentioned that promptness in issuing T.C./ Bonafide is good.
- Nearly 68.00% students expressed their satisfaction as excellent regarding the distribution of scholarships.
- 50.00% students came up with a slight negative response on letters sent to students.
- A considerable thought provoking response with 75.33% regarding guidance and counseling by office was provided by students.
- 70.66% students appreciated promptness in solving difficulties.
- Almost 70.00% students registered their response as very good on the behavior of employees with students.
- Majority of students were negative regarding the point of behavior of employees and time management in terms of distribution of various forms.

ANNEXURE-V
ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK OF LIBRARY BY THE STUDENTS (2013-2014)

Introduction :

Libraries are institutions which play a crucial role in social development. Dr. S.R. Rangnathan a luminary and a visionary in the field of library science compared library to a growing organism.

Objectives :

- 1) To study efficiency and availability of library services to students.
To evaluate the present status of library of the college.

Methodology :

A questionnaire, bearing 13 questions, was provided to the students. The primary data is collected from 99 students. Five point scale technique was used to find out the feedback.

Results :

- Almost 44.66% students appreciated the adequate availability of newspapers, periodicals and journals and the library awareness created by the staff among the students.
- Nearly 48.66% students were of the opinion that there is sufficient availability of reading material for competitive examinations and considerable easiness in getting identity card.
- 56.00% Students came up with a positive response and their rating excellent on seating arrangement in the reading room/night library and cleanliness.
- 51.33% students maintained that there was adequate availability of necessary texts, reference and other books.
- 43.33% students evaluated the display and availability of new arrivals as very good and satisfactory.
- Almost 42.00% students were of the opinion that readiness to provide library service was highly appreciative and excellent.
- Nearly 64.00% students were critical about the behavior of library staff with students and answered that it was good enough.
- Perhaps the two most conspicuous aspects with which the students registered their response as average and hopeless were promptness in providing unavailable books and facility of Xerox (reprography).
- A number of thoughtful students came up with their suggestions about library.
 - i) Xerox facility should be provided.
 - ii) Library should increase the number of books for reading.
 - iii) To make viability of competitive examination reference.
 - iv) Periodicals, books and journals must supply to students on demand.
 - v) New arrivals in library must be displayed on notice board.
 - vi) To improve the library service.

ANNEXURE-VI
ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK OF TEACHERS BY THE STUDENTS (2013-14)

Introduction :

The development of all round personality requires the teachers to do more than mere teaching. It is said that the mediocre teacher tells, the good teacher explains, the superior teacher demonstrates and the great teacher inspires. The teacher with unimpeachable integrity of character, qualities of leadership, environmental awareness and acquaintance with the day to day development in the chosen discipline becomes a source of inspiration mentor and model for students. The teachers in general should have a strong ether commitment. The assessment of the teacher should be concerned with the major attributes relating to the professional and subject related aspect, and overall impression of a teacher.

Objectives :

The objectives of feedback on teachers by students are as follow.

- 1) To find out general attitude related performance and relative status of a teacher.
- 2) To find out subject related performance and relative status of a teacher.
- 3) To involve the students participation in the process of quality enhancement.
- 4) To examine the overall impression of a teacher.

Methodology :

A questionnaire, comprising 25 question, 13 question related to general/ attitude and 12 question related to subject, was provided to the students to take feedback on all aspects of the teacher. The B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. third year students were selected randomly to collect the required information. The collected data was classified according to each faculty. A five point scale – Excellent (5), Very good (4), Good (3), Average (2) and below average (1) was used to evaluate the performance of a teacher weighted mean was used to find out the performance weights being A. 40 and B. 60 are considered and the total of actual points obtained are multiplied by 40 for general/ attitude related aspect and the total actual points obtained in subject rotated aspect was multiplied by 60. Thus, total score is calculated and lineally group total with respective weight is obtained for total weighted score and is divided by number of students to get weighted mean. The maximum weighted score of general/attitude related part (A) is considered as 2600 and maximum weighted score of subject related part (B) is considered as 3600. Thus, total score 6200 is considered to obtain actual score of a teacher. The percentage of teachers are categorized according to the points obtained in the scales grade A1 above 80, grade A-60.80 and grade B below 60 and the part C is used for overall impression and suggestions.

Findings :

The following are the important finding of the feedback.

- The analysis of the feedback reveals that out of the total 29 Faculty, 19 belong to 'A1' grade, 9 belong to 'A'-grade in general/attitude related aspects. There was one who was rated as 'B' grade (With less than 60 point score)
- It is found that out of the total of 29 faculty, 21 belong to 'A1'-grade (with the score of above 80 points) and 7 belong to 'A'-grade (with 60-80 score points) in the subject related aspects. In this area also, there was one who represented 'B' grade.

- In the overall performance (A-general/attitude related aspect & B-subjects specific) out of the total of 29 faculty, 18 belong to 'A1' grade while 10 belong to 'A' grade. It is also noteworthy that one was representing 'B' grade underlining the fact that the performance of faculty was quite good and satisfactory.

Suggestions :

- Specific suggestions based on the overall performance of particular teacher are as follows :
Common – expectations – cum – suggestions by Students :
 - i) Faculty should maintain friendly behaviour with the students.
 - ii) Faculty should focus on the tough (difficult to understand) part of the syllabus.
 - iii) Faculty should conduct test exams based on university exam pattern.
 - iv) Faculty should provide notes and MCQ is as per the chapter.
 - v) Teacher's should conduct class on time. They should follow the class timing and regularity of conducting classes. They should not dissolve the class before the stipulated time.
 - vi) Faculty should not hasten to complete the syllabic.
 - vii) Faculty should provide extracurricular and other personality development counselling kind of Knowledge along with the syllabic knowledge.
 - viii) College Faculty should organize special and scholarly guest lectures.
 - ix) Motivate be allowed to actively participate in the teaching learning process. Active involvement of students should be ensured by faculty.
 - x) Faculty should create interest and liking for the subject among students.
 - xi) Students proper guidance to students on higher education and opportunities available in different areas.
 - xii) Ensure and increase active involvement and participation of students in teaching learning process.

Best Practice 1:

1. Title of the Practice:

Adasrh College Shikshak Sanchalit
Garib va hotkaru Vidyarthi Vidyarthini Vastigrah

2. Goal

- To provide basic facilities like lodging and boarding to poor students.
- To decrease the student drop-out ratio of the college.
- To maintain interest of the students in education system.
- To inculcate and enhance the qualities like discipline, ethics, self-reliance and national integrity, sportsmanship etc. in the students.
- To make the students mentally strong
- To encourage students to participate in social activities.

3. The Context

Due to financial problems students can't complete even their graduation. Also financial problems create greater nervousness about education in the students. In addition, this contributes to reduce student's drop ratio in this area. To overcome this problem we started this best practice on 13.08.2002. 151 students have taken the benefits through this practice. Out of these 15 are girl students.

In Hingoli district students are coming from rural area where they will not get the proper environment for their education. With this practice we try to give healthy environment for their future education.

4. The Practice

An advisory committee of members headed by the Principal is formed to look after this practice. Coordinator of this practice is Mr. Sudhakar Ingole (Jr. College Teacher)

(A) Admission Process :

In the beginning needy students have to apply to get benefit of this practice. General list of students is displayed on notice board and students are called for personal interview. After this committee, selects the students for this practice.

The selection is based on student's financial status, educational status and personal interview. Selected candidate will get this facility only for one academic year. An advisory committee regularly checks the educational and financial status of the students.

(B) Facilities :

The selected students will get lodging and boarding facility. A room with tube light, fan, and regular water supply and sanitary system is provided to the students. Meal is provided to the candidates with the help of mess. Medical facility is also provided according to need. In future solar water heater facility will be provided to the students.

(C) Funding or Finance :

A separate joint account has been opened in the Nagnath Co-operative Bank, Hingoli. The Chairman (Principal) and the Coordinator maintain this account.

At the beginning, college staff deducted Rs.50/- per month from their salary. Arrangement of meal and other general expenses are made by these funds. Nowadays we collect 100/- Rs. cash per month from college staff throughout the year.

Retired staff members and successful students through this scheme also donate funds to this best practice. Today we have Rs. 4.5 lack in account as a balance. Day today expenses are maintained by this financial arrangements or funds.

5. Evidence of Success:

With this best practice students get the benefit to build up their career. Students get not only educational environment but also improves the moral values like discipline, ethics & national integrity. Regular counseling and financial support improves their confidence level. Students are not only going for further studies but also preparing for competitive examination.

Many students completed their graduation or post graduation study. Number of student got the job after completing their study using this facility. Most of the students enter into teaching field, Civil, Police and Military services.

Following poor boys students are working in different areas and also donated funds to this practice.

- Mr.Murlidhar Shinde (Lecturer at New Model college, Hingoli) donated Rs.5000/-
- Mr.Ramdas Shinde (BAMS, Student) donated Rs.500/-
- Ganesh Belokar completed his M.A.Political Science and he stood merit third in S.R.T.M.University. He donated Rs.2000/- for this scheme.

Gangadhar Gore, Pandurang Vaidya, Shaikh Jameer, Shankar Rakhonde are working as teacher at different places. Shankar Baghate joined in military. Till date this best practice is successfully run by our college staff without a break or gap from last 11 years.

As maximum students in this college are coming from rural area, they are economical backward so their rooms or where they live don't have study environment and regular electricity supply. These things will disturb their mind about study. So to provide better atmosphere this Night library practice is implemented from the establishment of this college till yet.

4. The Practice:

Hingoli is educationally backward and surrounded by rural area. This practice has been started from the beginning of this college. Night library start one month before the examination schedule and runs till the end of examination. Working hours for Night library are from 7:00 pm to 11:00 pm. One library attendant is always present to monitor and control the students and also maintain the students' attendance record.

Two staff members regularly visit the Night library to encourage the students. Night library is reading room provided with sitting arrangement, adequate light, fans, ample drinking water and urinals. Inverter is also provided maintaining regular electricity supply.

On an average 50 students get the benefit of this night library regularly. Students can get additional reference books, text book against their I-card during night library hours.

Night library is one of the best practices which provides healthy atmosphere to study and improve overall result of our college.
